

International FM Strategy Conference in Thailand

In June this year our base leaders, Mas and Karlyn Mataitoga, along with ministry leaders, Ross and Sheryll Watkins, went to Bangkok (Thailand) for the Family Ministries Strategy conference. Around 50 leaders gathered from all around the world to discuss and strategise on Family Ministries' future goals and vision. This was a great opportunity to learn from other bases and schools around the globe and identify the pressing needs.

One of the big ministry areas we want to refocus on is YWAM staff families: those in the mission field who need practical teaching, advice and support. Family Ministries has tools and knowledge that could be immensely valuable in helping establish healthy families in mission. We want Family Ministries to be viewed as a "power-house" for equipping and releasing families, not just a "hospital" for receiving those broken and burnt-out from ministry. We want to see families THRIVING, not just surviving, in ministry and mission. We hope that focusing on these families will multiply our effectiveness: As they go out and apply the tools they have learned, many other families in their ministries, communities and nations will also be reached and transformed. Such exciting possibilities!

Property Update

Our Family Ministries Trust is continually working behind the scenes to maintain and improve the facilities on this magnificent property, Crystal Springs, which God has entrusted to us to use for His glory.

Since our last newsletter, several significant improvements have been completed. **Heat pumps** have now been installed in all our staff housing (praise the Lord!), and a further two student/guest units have undergone **makeovers** to replace aged and damaged flooring. Plans are also in progress to replace some inadequate electrical wiring to the Lower House.

Looking ahead, there are two major projects which the Trust is prayerfully considering;

1. New purpose-built rooms for children's ministry

Providing quality care and discipleship for the children and teenagers of student families during our training schools is an extremely valuable part of what we do here at Family Ministries. For the past 16 years, creative use of existing base facilities has enabled our team to provide excellent creche and base school programmes for these student families. However, we would dearly love to be in the position to permanently house both these programmes within one purpose-built facility.

The Trust is actively exploring the feasibility of demolishing the old "sound-shell" building, located within the children's playground, which has become leaky and hazardous in recent years, rendering it unfit for further use. Our vision is to replace this structure with a brand-new facility designed specifically for the needs of our children's ministry. This is a major project, requiring a significant investment of time and finances.

2. Heating for A-frame dining area

Anyone who has visited Crystal Springs during the winter months will attest to the need for this project to go ahead! The base dining-room is located in the centre of our distinctive "A-frame" building at the entrance to the property. While this building is attractive and functional in many ways, heating the dining area with its high, apex ceiling has proven very difficult. It is not uncommon to see individuals huddled around the tables wrapped tightly in blankets to ward off the chilly air! The Trust are currently investigating numerous options for installing the most efficient, cost-effective heating system for this room.
